Current function

Brigadier General Soller commands Ground Based Air Defence Brigade 33 and is responsible for basic training in its schools and courses, as well as for the readiness of anti-aircraft units. He reports to the Commander of the Swiss Air Force.

As Commander of Ground Based Air Defence Brigade 33, he is also responsible for all anti-aircraft resources of the Swiss Armed Forces: three medium anti-aircraft battalions (35mm) and three light-weight ground-to-air guided missile system battalions (Stinger). Brigadier General Soller supports superior command levels in the development of operational and training doctrine in the context of effects in the air, and contributes significantly to the further development of ground-based air defence.
